Over the last 50 years, generations of alumni have benefited from the transformative power of the education and experiences gained here.



## **MSVV on Facebook & Instagram**

## **E Motorbike**

A team of students from Modern School, Vasant Vihar, collaboratively designed and developed a fully functional electric motorcycle (e-bike) as part of an interdisciplinary project under the guidance of our alumnus, Mr. Gaurav Raj Batra, CEO, Rabyta with mentorship from Mr. Prithvi Raj Tiwari, PGT (Physics). The team—Devika Raj Batra, Daksh Pruthi, Rayaana Sachdeva, Vir Dandona, Rabani Kohli, and Yadur Babbar, students of Grades XI/XII —was involved in every stage of the project, from motor selection and battery configuration to microcontroller programming and sensor calibration. The team successfully completed the e-motorbike, earning recognition for innovation, technical proficiency, and sustainable design.

## **Solar Fan**

A Solar Powered BLDC Fan, innovatively designed by Devika Raj Batra of Grade XI, received support from the school at all stages of development, in line with MSVV's consistent commitment to sustainability and promotion of green initiatives. Powered by electricity generated from solar panels and stored in rechargeable batteries, the fan ensures uninterrupted use, even during power outages—making it especially impactful in rural and off-grid communities. At its core is the BLDC (Brushless Direct Current) motor, designed without brushes to minimize friction and wear. Consuming 50–65% less energy than conventional fans, it not only reduces electricity bills but also significantly cuts down carbon emissions.

This innovation was presented to the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Smt. Rekha Gupta, and the Hon'ble Education Minister, Shri Ashish Sood, during the Independence Day celebrations on August 11, 2025, reinforcing the institution's role as a torchbearer of environmental stewardship and eco-friendly practices.

## **Admissions 2025 - 26**

The timeline for admission to Entry Level Classes (below six years of age) for open seats (excluding EWS/DG/CWSN Category Seats) for the academic session 2025-26 was received from the Directorate of Education and was duly implemented. A draw of lots was carried out and a list of selected candidates was displayed as per the timeline.

## **Academics**

- The new academic session 2025–26 commenced on April 1, 2025, for Kindergarten (Pre-Primary) to Grade XII while Nursery (Pre-School) began on April 2, 2025.
- Academic instruction, lesson plans, assessments, and examinations were conducted as per planned schedule.
- Pre-School and Pre-Primary course books were upgraded, and notebooks were prepared in-house by the faculty members themselves.
- To support students in strengthening foundational concepts and addressing individual learning gaps, remediation sessions were held in groups to provide targeted academic assistance based on student performance.
- Regular monitoring, feedback from subject teachers, and interaction with parents during PTMs helped to track student progress effectively.
- In addition to the regular Parent-Teacher Meetings held as per the academic calendar, the school introduced a system of Open Days to further strengthen parent-school collaboration.
- In compliance with government directives, classes were conducted in hybrid mode as and when required.
- TGT & PGT staff members were appointed as Examiners (practical exams), Evaluators, Observers, and Head Examiners by CBSE for evaluation of AISSE & AISSCE Examinations.
- The school was designated as an evaluation centre for AISSE – English. The evaluation process was conducted under the supervision of CNS, Ms. Vibha Khosla.
- Orientation sessions were held in the first fortnight of April, offering parents an overview of the school's curriculum, teaching practices, and key policies. These sessions highlighted the importance of parental involvement in a child's learning journey and included an interactive Q&A that addressed suggestions, feedback, and concerns.

## **CBSE Board Examination for Grades X and XII 2025**

- Chinmaya Vidyalaya, Vasant Vihar, served as the examination centre for 131 students of AISSE and 137 students of AISSCE from Modern School, Vasant Vihar, in 2025.
- Following the declaration of results, students who had anticipated higher scores applied for re-evaluation of their answer scripts. An overview of the CBSE Results 2025 is presented below:

### Higher Education




The Career Counseling services at school extend beyond course and university selection; we provide holistic assistance throughout the application process. - Shayan Verma and Samaksh Verma, Grade X, performed exceptionally well in the final stage of LogIQids mental aptitude Olympiad held on March 20, 2025. Samaksh secured the third position and Shayan secured the sixth position at the school level.
- Saanvi Singh, Grade I, was awarded a Certificate of Excellence in GC International Spell Bee Olympiad organized by International Olympiad - Genius Cerebrum on May 11, 2025
- Aura Aggarwal, Grade V, Aarav Dhawan and Smayan Arora, Grade X, have been shortlisted for the LQ Ideathon – Young Thinkers Challenge, an initiative by LogIQids in collaboration with Techfest, IIT Bombay. The LQ Ideathon - Young Thinkers Challenge is a platform designed to inspire young minds to develop creative, actionable solutions for today's pressing challenges to shape a better tomorrow. This competition invites children to foster critical thinking, problem-solving, and adaptability in a structured environment. These students have stood out as some of the brightest young minds in the country, rising

above **17 lakh participants** in the LogIQids Olympiad 2024–25, a remarkable achievement that speaks volumes about their talent and the nurturing environment of the school.

- The school secured second position in junior category and first position in senior category of the Cathedral Aryabhata Mathematics competition held on July 19, 2025. Daksh Pruthi, Grade XII secured the second position in the same competition.
- Rudaan Sabharwal, Grade II, earned international rank#3 in Logiqids Mental Aptitude Olympiad held on February 23, 2025. Result was declared on August 14, 2025.

Ms. Saloni Bhatia, Teacher In-Charge, was honoured with the Best District Teacher Award by SOF in recognition of her dedication and initiatives. She was felicitated with a trophy, a citation, and cash award of INR 1000.

## **Collaborations**

Modern School collaborated with various educational agencies to promote community engagement and social responsibility among students. Activities such as workshops, service projects, and awareness campaigns were undertaken to address issues like environmental sustainability, social justice, and health. These initiatives encouraged students to connect with peers and experts, broadening their perspectives and fostering empathy.

### **With MIE (Modern Institute for Education)**

#### **Workshop on Play based Pedagogy**

The two-day workshop on Play-Based Pedagogy aimed at enhancing the teaching strategies of primary school teachers was hosted and conducted by Modern School, Vasant Vihar on December 3 & 4, 2024 in collaboration with the Modern Institute for Education (MIE). It was attended by 43 primary teachers from various NDMC schools.

The session focused on integrating play as a fundamental element in the learning process, emphasizing its role in fostering holistic development in young learners, and equipping teachers with innovative techniques that seamlessly blended play with learning. It also aimed to demonstrate how play-based learning can enhance cognitive, social, emotional, and physical development among students.

The facilitators, Ms Radhika Luthra, Ms Catherine Thomas, Ms Anubha Sharma, and Ms Meeta Narain, Faculty, discussed the theoretical framework and benefits of this approach, highlighting its alignment with child development principles. Various tools such as flashcards, stick puppets, balloons, and clay were employed to support play-based learning and to integrate subjects like mathematics, science, and languages during the practical demonstration.

Teachers participated in hands-on activities such as role-playing, collaborative games, and creative storytelling, showcasing how these methods can be effectively applied in classroom settings. The workshop was highly engaging and well-received by the participants.

#### **Workshop on English Language and Literacy**

Ms. Radhika Verma, Ms. Ruchi Chawla, and Ms. Geetanjali Devasar, Faculty, conducted a comprehensive two-day workshop on English Language and Literacy in collaboration with the Modern Institute for Education (MIE) on March 18 and 19. It was attended by approximately 50 teachers from various NDMC schools.

The primary objective of the workshop was to enhance the participants' teaching methodologies and equip them with effective strategies to improve students' language proficiency. During the workshop, educators engaged in a variety of interactive and hands-

on activities, including phonics-based reading strategies, storytelling techniques, creative writing exercises, and collaborative learning tasks.

### **YaRI (Yamuna river Initiative)**

Project YaRI (Yamuna River Initiative), initiated under the insightful mentorship of Ms. Ambika Pant, is a pioneering educational initiative that seeks to foster awareness, critical thinking, and a sense of responsibility among students toward one of India's most historically and ecologically significant rivers — the Yamuna.

At its core, Project YaRI is an interdisciplinary learning journey that invites students to explore the historical, cultural, ecological, and environmental dimensions of the Yamuna River. By engaging with the river's story — from its mythological origins and spiritual importance to its present-day challenges of pollution and degradation — students are encouraged to reflect deeply on humanity's relationship with natural ecosystems and the urgent need for sustainable living.

To integrate river and water education meaningfully across the school curriculum, from the foundational to secondary stages, the MIE team developed two key educational resources:

**A student novel:** A narrative that creatively weaves facts and themes about the Yamuna into an engaging storyline, enabling students to learn through character-driven exploration and emotional connection.

**A teacher's handbook:** A practical resource designed to help educators embed themes of river conservation and environmental stewardship into multiple subjects — such as science, geography, history, literature, and art in a flexible and adaptable way. This interdisciplinary approach helps make the subject matter relatable and relevant to students across age groups and learning levels.

The musical, **Ambu Gatha**, staged during the Independence Day celebrations at our school, revolved around this initiative and was warmly appreciated by Hon'ble Chief Minister, Smt. Rekha Gupta who presided as the Chief Guest on the occasion, Hon'ble Education Minister, Shri Ashish Sood, MLA R K Puram, Shri Anil Sharma, members of Board of Trustees and Managing Committee, and distinguished guests.

## **Indian Pollution Control Association (IPCA)**

### **S.O.R.T Workshop**

On December 11, 2024, a workshop was organized by the Indian Pollution Control Association (IPCA) as part of the "Segregation of Waste for Recycling and Treatment" (S.O.R.T.) initiative. The workshop aimed to enhance awareness among students and staff regarding sustainable waste management practices and the significance of waste segregation. Attended by students of Grades VI to VIII, the session saw enthusiastic participation from both students and staff in adopting sustainable practices.

To support these efforts, **Aerobins** have been installed on campus to facilitate efficient waste segregation.

## **National Progressive Schools' Conference (NPSC)**

### **South Zone Chess Tournament**

Modern School, Vasant Vihar hosted 13 schools during the NPSC U-14 Chess Tournament for Boys & Girls (Zonal Level) on December 20-21, 2024. The players exhibited remarkable focus and commitment, making the event a memorable experience for all involved. MSVV team, comprising Devansh Rai, Adhiraj Binyani, Kiyaansh Kohli, Viaan Mehendiratta and Anay Saraff secured the second position in the tournament, bringing pride to the school.

## **Delhi Disaster Management Authority**

In accordance with the national directive and guidelines issued by the Delhi Disaster Management Authority (DDMA), an Air Raid mock drill was conducted in school on May 7, 2025. The objective of the exercise was to enhance preparedness in the event of a possible airborne attack, such as bombings or missile strikes from enemy aircraft or drones. ### **In House Activities**

A range of in-house activities are regularly organized with the objective of nurturing creativity, enhancing communication, and developing critical thinking skills among students. These activities are designed to cater to diverse interests and talents, fostering holistic development. They not only provide students with opportunities to showcase their abilities but also help cultivate essential life skills such as teamwork, time management, and problem-solving, thereby preparing them for future challenges. Some of the prominent activities include calligraphy, Show and Tell, *Kavita Vachan*, *Kahani Buno*, Just-a-Minute sessions, slogan writing, poster making, rakhi making, show and tell, to name a few among others.

### House System & Activities

The House System is a well-established and integral part of school life aimed at promoting holistic development through teamwork, leadership, and healthy competition. Under this system, students of Grades III to XII are divided into eight houses – Arjun, Bharat, C V Raman, Dhruv, Mother Teresa, Vivekanand, Razia Sultan and Amrita Shergil. Each house includes students across grades, ensuring vertical integration, where older students mentor and guide the younger ones. Houses are managed by House Masters/Mistresses, student captains, and vice-captains.

Throughout the academic year, students participate in a variety of group activities and competitions—both intra-house (within the house) and inter-house (between houses)—spanning sports, cultural events, academics, and community service. This structured system not only encourages active participation but also helps students discover their strengths, hone their talents, build confidence, and develop essential life skills such as communication, time management, and teamwork.

Regular assemblies form an integral part of our commitment to holistic education. Held routinely, these assemblies serve as platforms to promote general awareness, address global and environmental issues, and nurture responsible citizenship among students.

Each class is given the opportunity to lead an assembly on a designated day, enabling students to display their talents and present their understanding of diverse topics.

The presence of parents further enriches the experience, transforming these assembly days into shared celebrations of learning and growth.

It is an attempt at motivating students to become social contributors and encourages participants to research, analyze and innovate, while working with a social conscience.

### Excellence in Research Award:

This year, 25 students of Grade XI competed for this coveted award. 17 projects, ranging from building an app for autistic children, to building water purifiers, were submitted. The results are as follows:

1. **Devika Raj Batra**, stood **first** for her research on 'How Spatial Design and Structural Conditions in Urban Slum Housing Drive Respiratory and Vector-Borne Disease Outcomes'. The water purifier she has built is an easy and well-priced solution to the problem of contaminated water in slum areas.
2. **Aanya Jain**, who stands **second**, partnered with a company to absorb 30 specially abled people into the work force, providing them economic independence. She has been engaged in holding Indian Sign Language workshops. Her work also involves staging plays with specially abled actors.
3. Working on 'Preserving natural water bodies in Urban India - an empirical study on a community led project in the National Capital Region', **Ayesha Gupta**, who bagged the **third** position, has taken up the responsibility of restoring a pond in her locality with local support.

### Excellence in Photography Award:

The **Sardar Bhagwant Singh Photography Competition** was conducted in July 2025 and was themed 'Rivers' in alignment with the YaRi initiative undertaken by school. The competition aimed to encourage students of Grade VIII to explore and appreciate the beauty of nature, specifically rivers, through their lens. The results are as follows:

### **Astronomy Club**

Members of the Astronomy Club attended an overnight camp in two batches from November 25 to 27, 2024 at Astroport, Sariska. The first astronomy session was conducted by Ms. Sunita, featuring star origins and telescope observations (e.g., Jupiter bands), planisphere mapping and constellations plotting on special sky kits. Students identified constellations like Andromeda, Aquarius, Vega, and more.

A session on Hydrobot organized on December 30, 2024 was attended by 52 students of Grades VI to X. The session started with an informative power point presentation behind the physics of hydraulics and it's uses, with a few questions sprinkled in between followed by creation and assembling of hydraulic robot, or hydrobot by students under supervision.

On January 27, 2025, a session on building megastructures was conducted to provide students with in-depth knowledge about Megahedron and Truss structures. The session explored the principles and applications of Truss structures in architecture, along with insights into Tetrahedron and Megahedron figures. Emphasis was placed on the role of Truss structures in enhancing the stability of buildings and preventing collapses during earthquakes.

Following the theoretical overview, the session transitioned into a hands-on activity where students constructed Truss models using specialized kits. These student-built structures were then tested for their strength and weight-bearing capacities, allowing participants to apply their knowledge practically and understand the engineering concepts involved.

On January 31, 2025, a session on safe solar observation techniques was conducted where students were introduced to the Sun's position in the Solar System, its significance, and the phenomenon of solar flares, including their causes, effects, and predicted occurrences in 2025. Also, the impact of harmful UV rays and the protective role of Earth's magnetosphere were discussed, emphasizing the importance of safe observation methods. To extend their learning beyond the session, students were provided with a Pin Hole Camera Kit, enabling them to safely observe the Sun at home.

### **Interact Club**

To commemorate World Interact Day, the Rotary Club of Delhi organised the Delhi Interact Leadership Assembly at Maitreyi College on November 5, 2024. This annual event, renowned for its vibrant atmosphere and impactful community initiatives, brought together students, faculty, and Interact members from schools across Delhi.

Our school participated in 'OGAAN,' a sweater donation drive organized by the Rotary Club, by contributing one hundred sweaters for distribution to those in need.

The school contributed three bicycles to 'Wheels of Opportunity,' an initiative supporting underprivileged girls. The event also included cultural presentations such as street plays, dance, and music, and provided students with a platform to interact with Interact Clubs from various schools.

On December 11, 2024, a Thalassaemia Awareness Session for students of Grades VI to IX and XI was conducted by Dr. J.S. He emphasized the critical role of regular blood donations in managing the condition and highlighted the importance of genetic counselling and early detection in its prevention.
